Reading Passage: AITA Stories

Background: AITA (Am I the A**hole?) is a [Reddit forum](#) where people ask others to judge if their actions were appropriate or not. Below are some summaries of interesting AITA posts.

Task: Read and discuss each story. Assess if the OP (original poster) is **YTA** (You're The A**hole), **NTA** (Not The A**hole), **NAH** (No A**holes Here), **ESH** (Everyone Sucks Here) or **INFO** (Not enough information).

1. The Pet: I'm 34, and I've been with my **fiancé**, Tim, for a couple of years. He recently moved in with his 9-year-old daughter, Emily, who has strong **allergies** to dogs. The problem is, I have a 7-year-old golden retriever, Max, who's been my close friend through everything. Tim knew about Max from the start, but now that we're living together, he's demanding that I get rid of my dog for Emily's safety.

I suggested keeping Max out of Emily's room, deep cleaning, using air purifiers, or even keeping Max here part-time—but Tim **shot down** every idea. He says I need to "put Emily first." Because I'm not willing to give up Max, he says that I'm selfish and not ready to be a stepmom. To me, Max is family. I can't imagine **abandoning** him. Am I wrong for **standing my ground**?¹

2. The Key: I should start by saying my mother-in-law is very **nosy**. My husband (37m) and I (34f) just bought a new house and she kept pushing us for a spare key "for emergencies." The thing is, she had an "emergency" key to our old apartment and used it to walk in on us twice while we were having sex. I couldn't trust her, so I gave her a fake key to our new place.

Then at Christmas dinner, she **criticized** me in front of everyone because I had given her a "fake key". When I asked how she knew it was fake, she admitted she'd tried to let herself in when we weren't home (without an emergency). I reminded her she'd promised only to use it if necessary. She turned red and went into the kitchen and had a **meltdown**. The rest of dinner was **awkward**. My husband says I ruined Christmas and demands that I apologize to her. Seriously, AITA?²

3. Getting Fired: I'm a high schooler with a weekend job at a coffee shop. Customers get super angry at me over nothing. So my coworker James (the owner's son) thought up a plan. One day, a guy was shouting at me about his coffee not being hot enough, so James comes in and "fired" me **on the spot**, and I played along, pretending to be shocked and sad. The guy immediately changed his mind, apologizing and saying it wasn't a big deal. James refuses, insisting "We pride ourselves on the best customer service."

We've done this a couple times now and it usually results in the customer apologizing. Honestly it's a pretty satisfying **prank**. I told my friends about it, but some said it's **cruel**. AITA for letting people think they got me fired?³

- 5) Generally speaking, why do people often complain about their "in-laws"?

- 6) In the third story, why do you think customers apologized after James joined the conversation?
- 7) Why might the OP's friends think that the prank is cruel?

Speaking Activity: Roleplay (pick a role)

Possible expression: We don't need kids having a meltdown at our wedding.
